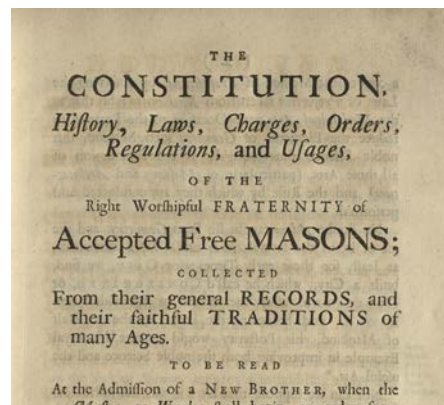

# Would I know the answer?

## Did I know the answer?

*By W Bro Dennis W. Roberts, PAGDC Group Leader Information and Guidance Group*

**I was asked: Why do we say point left right, point left right one two?**

**Thank you Roger for your question.**

As with so many things in Masonry, there are a number of explanations/opinions. I will offer you three of them.

Firstly, if you refer to a previous article on Masonic Fire, you will see the military association with artillery. Before firing, the commander would call the attention of the group to the field of battle to check the position of enemy or friend, and also check the direction of enemy fire. Having set his target he would check all around for clarity before firing; the countdown of one, two - fire. Masonic Lodges adopted this routine for their own interpretation; a salute to the leaders.

A second interpretation is that it is Masonic; suggesting that we include all of our Masonic friends in the salute. We start with you; then those to either

side, suggesting the inclusion of all Masons worldwide. This is done to show our brotherly love etc. to all fellow Masons.

The third explanation is more esoteric; similar explanations can be found in most other groups who recognise Christian Masonry. It points out what should be our awareness of the presence of the Most High and by pointing all around we acknowledge his being everywhere and in all of our lives. By doing so we can regulate our actions for the good of all our fellow beings throughout all that we do.

Reading through this, I wonder if I have made things less clear, but that is the nature of our ritual. All too often I hear the question of 'Where is this recorded?' and the answer is usually 'it is not'. I remember a Past PGM telling me, as Secretary, to record as much as possible, human memories are very brief and a true record is invaluable.

I look forward to further questions and wish you all a very Merry Christmas and a Happy and prosperous New Year.

## Tallin Visit

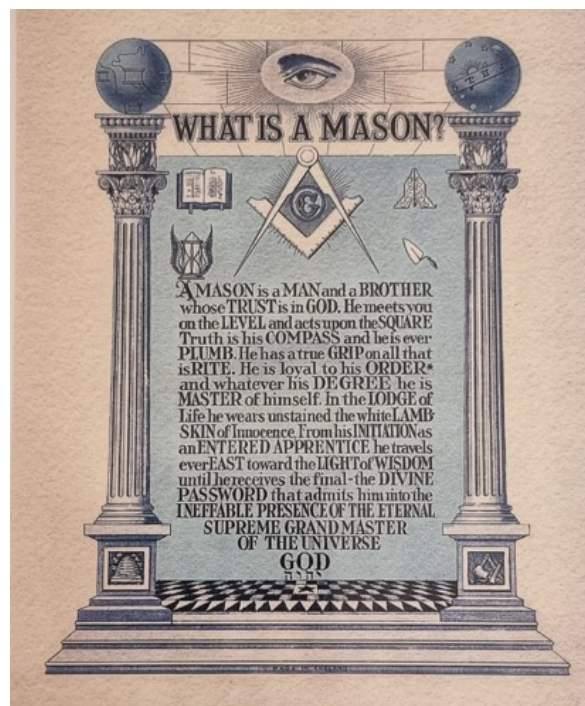
Bro Alex Walker of Vitruvian Lodge was recently on a group visit to Tallin in Estonia.

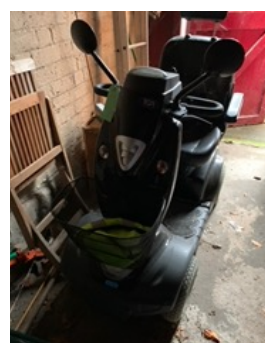

They are an independent unit which receives no funding from the MOD, and therefore every penny they need to keep the Unit running is either donated or raised by their own efforts.



The Ledbury Unit meets every Wednesday evening at the Burgage Hall, Church Lane, Ledbury between 7pm and 9pm. Cadets join as a New Entry, and once this has been completed get issued with three uniforms on loan.

Their activities include kayaking, field craft, PE, marine engineering, power boating, plus residential weekends.

The skills cadets pick up are impressive. Life skills, leadership skills, building confidence, working as a team, building a CV capable of impressing an employer when applying for a job, or a college application. It also teaches them respect and being a useful member of society and their local community.

Eastnor Lodge have an on-going relationship with the Ledbury Maritime Cadets, being able to support them in attaining specific goals, such as buying new equipment, enrolling cadets on kayaking courses and the general running of the unit.

# The Origins of the Provincial Banner.

Reprinted from "A History of Craft Freemasonry in Herefordshire 1727 - 2000" by Alwyn D Williams.



As in the case of most other Provinces in the English Constitution, Herefordshire adopted the arms of Grand Lodge but with certain additions which may be identified as being of local import. The arms of Grand Lodge are an amalgamation of those used by The Moderns in 1717 and The Antients in 1750 and which were merged at the Union of the two in 1813.

The first Provincial Banner was provided in 1817 by the Provincial Grand Master RW Bro. Richard P. Scudamore MP, but there is no trace of this today.

The second banner was presented on 11<sup>th</sup> November 1880 by the newly installed Provincial Grand Master, RW Br Sir Joseph Russell Bailey Bt. MP. afterwards Lord Glanusk. This banner is framed and hangs in the dining room of the Masonic Hall, Kyrle Street, Hereford, together with an explanation of its history.

The third banner was commissioned by Provincial Grand Lodge and presented to the Province on 6<sup>th</sup> May 1994. This hangs in the Lodge Room at Kyrle Street, Hereford and is shown in the picture above at the Provincial Cathedral Service in 2022.

Its depiction may be described as follows:

**Top Left:** The arms of the Scudamore (Skidmore) family comprising a shield quartered showing three stirrups leathered and buckled with partee cross, surmounted with a ducal crown (William Rufus) and a 'bears paw'. The motto 'Scuto amoris divini' translates as 'Shield of Divine Love'.

**Top Centre:** The Masonic Square and Compasses enclosed in a laurel wreath of honour.

**Top Right:** The arms of the City of Hereford comprising three lions passant guardant, crested with passant guardant lion holding erect sword in its Dexter paw. The motto 'Invictae Fidelitatis Praemium', translates as 'Reward for faithfulness unconquered'.

**Centre Shield:** Supported by two cherubims, it comprises three castles and chevron on which is an open set of compasses and on the right a lion, an ox, a man and an eagle. The shield is bordered by eight lions guardant which was added to commemorate the close Masonic ties with King Edward VII and as a token also to the rest of the Royal family. The shield is surmounted by the Ark of the Covenant with supporting cherubs with the Hebrew inscription 'Kodesh in Adonai', which translates as, 'Holiness to the Lord'. The shield bears the motto, 'Audi, Vide, Tace', which translates as, 'Listen, See, Be Silent;'

**Bottom Left:** The sun to rule the day.

**Bottom Right:** The moon to govern the night, for the Sun and the Moon are messengers of His will and all His law is concord.

**Bottom Centre:** The emblem of the Royal Arch Chapter comprising a double triangle (the Seal of Solomon) with the letter 'G' denoting 'Geometry'. One triangle is inscribed with the Greek word, Eypkamen and its Latin equivalent, 'Invenimus custor dei civis mundi', 'We have found the worship of God, O Citizens of the world'. On the reverse side is engraved, Wisdom, Strength, Beauty, Peace, Concord and Truth. The Jewel by its intersections forms a number of angles, which when reduced to right angles, are equal to the Five Platonic Bodies which represent the four elements and the Universal Sphere.



# The 1723 Constitutions

## Why are they important?

### But why were they so important?

The year 2023 marks the tercentenary of the publication in London of 'The Constitutions of the Freemasons', based on Enlightenment principles that provide the philosophical foundations of modern Freemasonry.

Many Masonic histories have been concerned with 'when' and 'what'. We also explore 'why?'.

The 1723 Constitutions championed Enlightenment ideas:

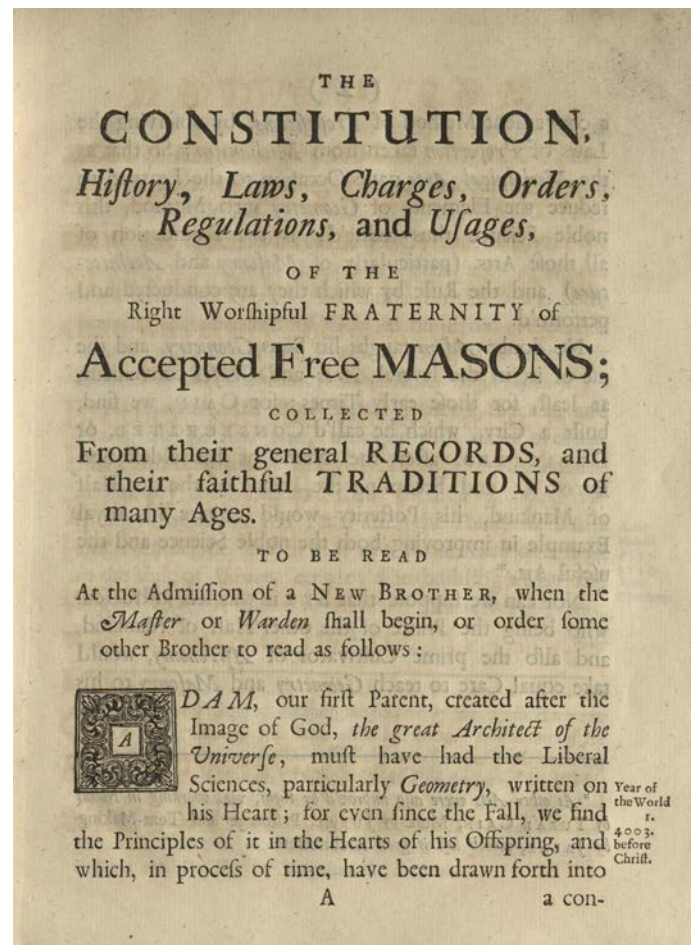
- Religious tolerance, which was radical in a world characterised by religious conflict
- Constitutional government – 'the supreme legislature', not the absolutism of a divinely appointed monarch
- Meritocracy at a time when birth and wealth determined success
- High standards of interpersonal civility
- Education and science – a world interpreted through rational observation rather than religious diktat
- Personal and societal self-improvement.

The 1723 Constitutions also provided a rulebook for Freemasonry – the 'Regulations' – and a structure emulated by many other secular clubs and societies in Britain and around the world.

Masonic practices included:

- The election of officers subject to democratic accountability, with one member wielding one vote
- Majority rule
- Orations by elected officials
- National federal governance
- Written constitutions and bylaws.

### James Anderson and the Traditional History

Born in Aberdeen, James Anderson was ordained into the Church of Scotland before travelling to London to take up a church ministry. Although commonly regarded as the author of the 1723 Constitutions, Anderson was neither its instigator nor responsible for its most important components, the Charges and the General Regulations, written by Desaguliers and George Payne.

Working under the direction of Desaguliers and the publishers, John Senex and John Hooke, Anderson was responsible for the Traditional History, an account of Freemasonry's development 'from the Beginning of the World', which set a literary context for the Craft.

By positioning Freemasonry as an ancient institution dating back to Adam, 'our first parent', the narrative gave the Grand Lodge of England legitimacy and status, and an aura that a recently formed organisation may otherwise have found difficult to achieve.

# The 1723 Exhibition at the Museum of Freemasonry

A year-long exhibition at the Museum of Freemasonry will be accompanied by events in the Provinces and international events.

The Constitutions of the Freemasons, published in 1723 on behalf of a young Grand Lodge of England, contained key philosophical principles to which Freemasons were expected to adhere: religious tolerance, constitutional government, civic responsibility, meritocracy, education, courtesy and benevolence.

They were accompanied by General Regulations, which set out an administrative structure for Freemasonry that contained radical principles, including the election of Lodge officers, with every member wielding one vote, and democratic accountability.

From January 2023, a new exhibition at the Museum of Freemasonry - featuring new digital components and items from the collections that

have never previously been on public display - explores how the 1723 Constitutions helped in 'Inventing the Future'.

Many assets have been digitalised and are held centrally, so as to be available to support Provincial exhibitions and other membership and education initiatives.



A range of exciting products have been launched to celebrate the tercentenary of the 1723 Constitutions.

Members can explore the product range and travel back in time through the 300 years of the Constitutions of Freemasons.

# ***The Masonic Great War Project***

**The Masonic Great War Project** website has been produced to provide a searchable database of Freemasons who took part in and died in the course of their duty during times of national conflict.

Six Brethren from Herefordshire Province lost their lives in WWI. Their names are recorded in the Masonic Roll of Honour 1914-1918 book which was commissioned by the United Grand Lodge of England and distributed around 1921.

The names are also recorded in the Shrine at the Peace Memorial Freemasons Hall, Great Queen Street which was completed by 1940.

Whilst the site is based only around Freemasons, it recognises the supreme sacrifice of all British, Commonwealth and Allied troops who lost their lives in the pursuit of a greater good.

# WHERE AM I?

*Last month we identified this well known Herefordshire landmark?*

An atmospheric Neolithic burial chamber made of great stone slabs set in the hills of the Golden Valley. Over 5,000 years old, legend has it a giant was slain here.

Off the beaten track with glorious views across the Black Mountains.

The answer was Arthur's Stone in the Golden Valley.

Arthur's Stone, a Neolithic chambered tomb, is over 5,000 years old. Today only the large stones of the inner chamber remain, though these were once covered by a long earthen mound.

W Bro Tim Fycun of Ariconium Lodge recounts that Arthur's Stone features in The Lion, The Witch and The Wardrobe as the basis for Aslan's altar after the author CS Lewis visited Herefordshire. Much of the Golden Valley is the basis for Narnia.

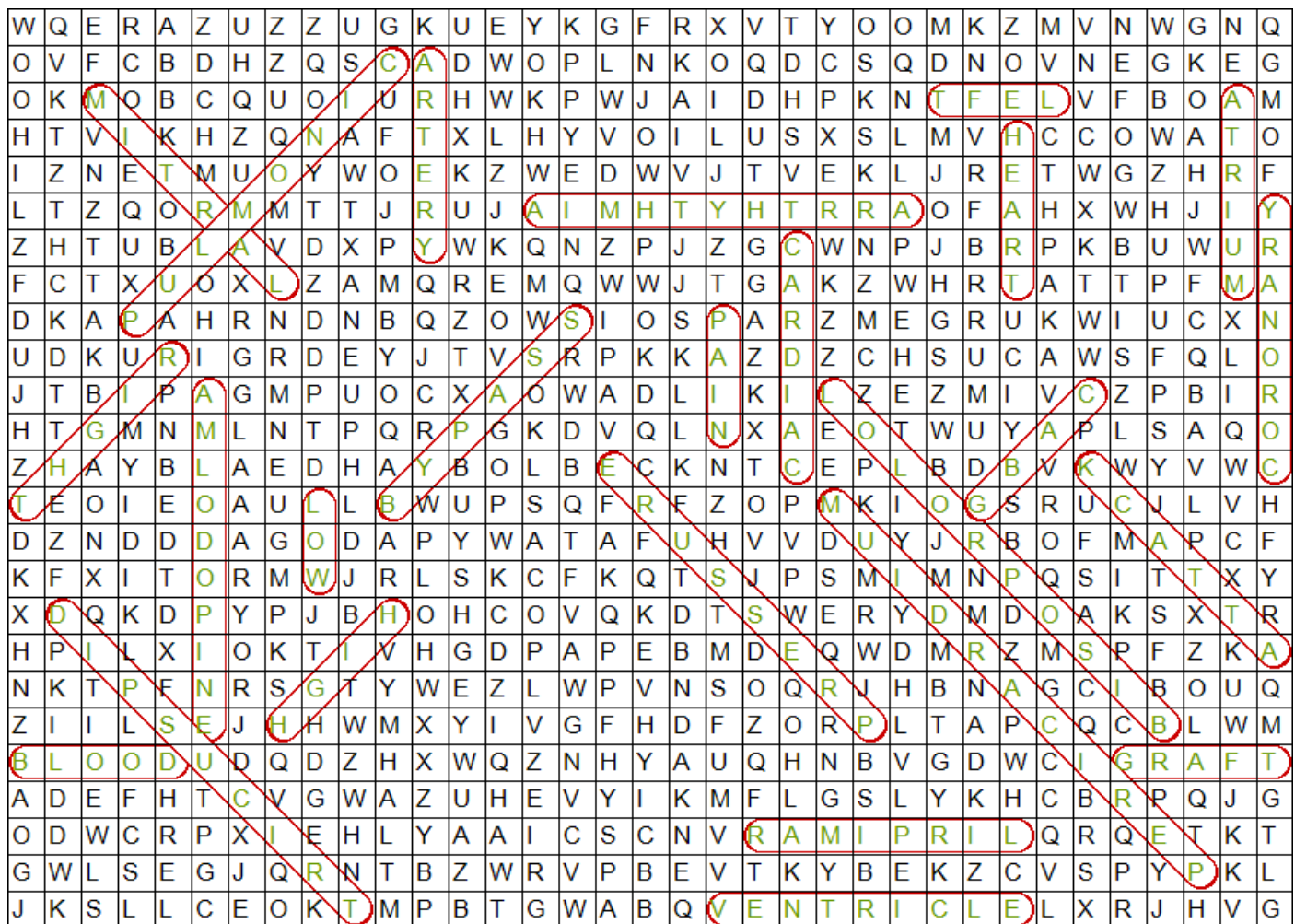
