

Would I know the answer?

Did I know the answer?

I asked: The Lodge Library?

I have referred to my bookshelf, gathering dust over the years, many times in previous articles. The new premises move in Ross on Wye led me to think of the placement of the ever present Lodge Library, and where it should go. I cannot think of any Lodge premises which do not have a shelf for Masonic books, usually close to the changing rooms. With the rapid advance of IT of course, many of the shelves of books have now also began to gather dust. When can you remember anyone taking one home to study; and equally so, when can you remember anyone referring to what they have seen on their computer, laptop or iPhone? We are all aware of what is readily available, especially on Solomon, but few take advantage.

The most prominent of the books is likely to be 'Gould's History of Freemasonry', a set of four, five or six books depending on its publication. You may be surprised to learn that such sets are readily available on ebay or Amazon for as little as £30, although rarer sets can make a few hundred pounds. They were considered the true reference for all things Masonic, and I was given a set which sits with many other books of reference, and yes, all gathering dust.

Robert Freke Gould (1836 - 1915) was a soldier, barrister and prominent Freemason and Masonic historian. The original set (1883-1887) was of six volumes, and still remains the standard reference work on the subject.

Gould was the son of the rector of Stoke Pero in Somerset and the brother of the Countess of Stafford. The younger brother of Thomas Wentworth Gould, Robert Freke Gould was born in Ilfracombe in Devon and joined the British Army aged 18 in 1855. A long service followed ending as company commander during the Second Opium War.

On leaving the Army he qualified as a barrister in 1868. He had become a Freemason in 1855 and was initiated in the Royal Navy Lodge No.429 in Ramsgate. From 1858 he devoted his life to writing and research. He was one of the founders of Quatuor Coronati Lodge in 1886. In 1913 he was made Past Grand Warden in honour of the Centenary of the United Grand Lodges of England. He died in Woking aged 78. It is difficult now to imagine the effort, time and enthusiasm with which he must have worked, without the advantages we now have at our fingertips.

So is it now time for your Lodge to dust off its library, and appreciate the research and enthusiasm for Masonry of our forebears? Or maybe we could put it all on ebay for a few pence and resort to the internet!

If you have not visited the 'Solomon' site lately, you should. There are now Videos, Podcasts and Webinars available for more in depth explanations. Facebook and Twitter also offer links for more information.

There is also a new link to Royal Arch Chapter which is worth a look.

Updating Our Core Values

"I think Service captures more fully our engagement in our communities".





Following the Pro Grand Master's address to September Quarterly Communication, our core principles have been revised to include Integrity, Respect, Friendship, and **Service**.

The complementary text for this is: Whether participating in events, fundraising for a charitable cause or volunteering for public or community organisations, service is at the very heart of Freemasonry. Our members make valuable contributions by donating time, resources and skills.

This modification is part of a larger review of UGLE's existing narrative, which was circulated via the First Rising sent out on Monday 18th September. You can access the full address on the UGLE website using this <u>link</u>.

Below is the relevant extract from the Pro Grand Master's speech:

'One conclusion the Rulers and members of the Strategy Working Party have reached is that the current, modern explanation of our principles in the terms of, "Integrity, Respect, Friendship and Charity", does not quite do justice to the breadth of your engagement in your communities. We believe it would be more appropriate to articulate the principles in terms of "Integrity, Respect, Friendship, and Service". Charity is one of the fundamentals of being a Freemason but is now often seen in monetary terms, rather than the broader terms of the past, which is true up to a point. Time, skills, and the willingness to do, however, are every bit as valuable to the communities in which we live, if not more so. I think Service captures more fully our engagement in our communities. I hope you will agree with this amendment to the modern statement of what are our principles.'



Moving On.....

Ross Masonic Centre Moves Site

Discussions to move the Ross Masonic Centre to new premises had been ongoing for some time. The Masonic Hall was an old converted Victorian School that had been home to the two Craft Lodges, Chapter and Mark Lodge since 1928. At that point it was already ninety one years old and the potential for large maintenance bills were always on the minds of the management company.

In spring 2023 an opportunity arose to acquire the Ross Methodist Church and, after finding a buyer for the existing centre and negotiations on the new property, the conveyancing commenced. Plans were drawn up to rearrange the internal layout of the new building to better accommodate the Temple, dining facilities and a meeting room; the idea being that the 'public areas' could be let out for the benefit of the local community.

A small team was assembled, led by W Bros Tom Maguire and Cliff McCloskey, to remove useful items from the old building and reposition them in the new premises. W Bro Tom Maguire recalls:

"We were able to bring the name boards going back to 1813 and the panelling and preserved many of the historical features of the old building into the new one. Volunteers helped in the move and decoration of the new Masonic Centre, as the pressure was on to finish in time for the start of the new season. By all working together we managed to finish the conversion and decoration in time for the first meeting, which was the September meeting of Vitruvian Chapter No 338. The first Craft meeting was Ariconium No 8868, which was further enhanced by bringing in a new Initiate. Both meetings were well attended to support the Lodge and Chapter and to see the new building".

Plans are now being made to provide the facilities for community events and an open day to showcase the new facilities to the public. This together with the support of the local Community Food Larder and volunteer work with the Churchyard Angels means that the Masonic Lodges and Chapter are firmly embedded in the local Ross on Wye community.

Here's to the next 100 years of Freemasonry in Ross on Wye!



Introducing The Royal Arch

The Completion Of The Journey.

Following on from our article on the Sussex Fudge in issue 80 - May 2023, where we discussed the process of uniting the two Grand Lodges in 1813, the Antients had recognised and practiced what we now consider the Royal Arch but the Moderns had not and so a compromise was established by the Duke of Sussex, the outcome of which has stood to this day.



The Preliminary Declaration at the front of the Book of Constitutions states that:

"By the solemn Act of Union between the two Grand Lodges of Free-Masons (sic) of England in December 1813, it was 'declared and pronounced that pure Antient Masonry consists of three degrees and no more, viz, those of Entered Apprentice, the Fellow Craft, and the Master Mason, including the Supreme Order of the Holy Royal Arch."

Therefore the Craft and the Royal Arch have a unique and indissoluble link in the English Constitution which means that every Freemason's journey in pure Antient Masonry remains incomplete until he has become a Companion of the Royal Arch.

Administration of the Royal Arch and its Chapters has been entrusted by UGLE to the Supreme Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of England. Our own Provincial Grand Master. RW Bro Michael T Holland, is also the Most Excellent Grand Superintendent in and over the Royal Arch Province of Gloucestershire and Herefordshire. As you can see from the title, we have a joint Royal Arch Province with the Craft Province of Gloucestershire. This means that there are thirty Chapters across Gloucestershire and Herefordshire from Leominster, Hay on Wye and Kington in the north down to Downend and Stapleton in the south. In Herefordshire there are seven Chapters to choose from.



Joining the Royal Arch (or 'Chapter') is the fourth and final stage in Pure Antient Masonry, as defined in the Act of Union of 1813 that created the current United Grand Lodge of England.

Anyone who has been a Master Mason for four weeks can join and should aspire to join the Royal Arch, because becoming a Companion of the Order continues their voyage of discovery.
