# Would I know the answer?

### Did I know the answer?

This month I asked: Why is the Volume of the Sacred Law opened on Chronicles 2 Chap.6?

A real question from one of our members; I am so pleased. But it did set me a real problem. I started by asking a large number of Masons, what is the practice in their own Lodges. The answers varied from 'not a clue', with some suggestions of what might be appropriate, through to 'we just open the book to a convenient place which is flat to hold the tools'.

I have discovered that some Lodges open the VSL for the First Degree at Chronicles 2 v.6 which mentions the settling of King Solomon on the throne of Israel. Of course, King Solomon was the son of King David and he had seen how his father had ruled Israel. Other Lodges open at Psalm 133 which talks of fellowship and like minded people.

So, I sought further, and looked at a number of Ritual books. Believe me, not even Emulation or the Book of Constitution mentions the point at which the book should be open. Some Lodges have markers to open the book at a predetermined point. I had assumed that all Lodges opened their VSL at the same point, but now understand that this is not the case, and as there are three degrees in Freemasonry, each degree has a separate series of verses pertinent to that degree.

For the Second Degree the book can be opened at Chronicles 2 Chap. 6 to show the building of the Temple, the pillars and other attributes. Other Lodges may open it at Ruth Chap. 1. "Where you lodge I will lodge, your people are my people." This depicts caring for the elderly. Boaz was such a person who showed caring in every way. Other Lodges choose Amos with the wall and the plumb line, to keep things true and guide and watch over others.

The Third Degree can be opened at Kings Chap.1, which shows David now an old man preparing to hand over to Solomon; a succession. Other Lodges may use Ecclesiastes chap. 12 v.1-7 which briefly restates that the First Degree covers youth, the Second Degree middle age and the Third Degree old age.

Other Degrees and Orders also use particular references such as Genesis in the Holy Royal Arch and John in the Red Cross of Constantine. All worth following through.

So, thank you Brother, for your question. It has caused me, and I hope you, to think more about our ritual and what we do and why. It seems that there are as many reasons and explanations for all of our work.

If you have not visited the 'Solomon' site lately, you should. There are now Videos, Podcasts and Webinars available for more in depth explanations. Facebook and Twitter also offer links for more information.

#### 🎇 Dean Leigh Masters Lodge

The Dean Leigh Masters' Lodge, No 3687, was consecrated in 1913 by the Grand Secretary VW Bro Sir Edward Letchworth FSA and Provincial Grand Master, the Right Worshipful Brother, the Very Reverend James Wentworth Leigh. He was Dean of Hereford from 1894 to 1919. The Consecration took place in the Hereford Town Hall, and afterwards the banquet was held at The Green Dragon Hotel.

The Lodge was set up as a Masters' Lodge in order to give those who had completed a year in the Chair of their own Lodge, the opportunity to continue the relationship they had established with many other Masters during that year.

It has traditionally met just three times each year and has an ethos of providing interesting talks and lectures covering a vast array of subjects, mostly Masonic, but occasionally on non-Masonic matters.

There is an open invitation to Past Masters from any Lodge to join. The subscription is modest, and there is a reduction for members who continue to hold membership in their Mother Lodge.



At the February 2024 meeting a talk on "The Operatives" was given by W Bro David Joyce PJGD. He explained his association with the Worshipful Company of Free Masons stretching back 20 years.

The Society was established in 1913 following the efforts of Clement Edwin Stretton, who in 1870 was indentured to an engineering firm in Leicester. For part of his training, he was required to work in a local quarry to understand the stone mason's work. But to learn that trade, he had to be admitted to the local Stonemason's Guild. However, with much of the manual work becoming mechanised and with the advent of trade unions, once qualified he recognised the progressive decline of that Guild and so he carefully recorded the processes through which he been taught.

Thus, the Society's ritual, based on his experiences, takes candidates through four degrees at local level, placing them on a journey through the methods of creating finished stones for a building, setting them and erecting them. Further degrees, carried out at regional level, involve more of the supervision and the administration of the work.

His talk was warmly received by the Brethren and his efforts were received with acclamation.




#### Sympathy Chapter Exaltation



#### Brethren



## **New and Useful Features**

#### Welcome to Solomon

Fostering curiosity - Developing Understanding Your Journey of Masonic Learning and Development

Solomon is a virtual learning environment designed to support a broader programme of learning and development within Lodges and Chapters. To have access to all the modules you must register for an account.



Solomon has undergone an extensive redesign over the past few months which have resulted in the following updates:

- **1. SolomonGPT** has been launched. Based on the technology of **ChatGPT** this allows you to ask questions based on Solomon material relevant to that module. While it is early days yet, this offers another way of interacting with Solomon.
- **2. Mentor's Corner** has now been updated with "Snippets", shorter versions of Nuggets and "Within hail", material for use with Entered Apprentices and Fellowcrafts if they are requested to leave the Temple temporarily.
- **3.** The "Welcome" modules are proving very popular with candidates. These are Welcome Apprentice, Welcome Fellowcraft, Welcome Master Mason and Welcome Companion. These modules are gamified to make the learning more fun and provides an explanation of our ceremonies to new members.
- **4. Lodge Matters** also has some interactive content that covers how the Lodge functions and the role of the Officers.
- **5. The Second Degree**, The Third Degree and Masonic History all have new and updated material.
- **6.** The user interface has been redesigned. Every module has a video that explains its purpose. Also, each section has a short video that summarises the content. Each file now has a standardised summary without having to open the PDF. This is extremely useful when using the Search facility. The Tags function has also been revised and is now available in all modules.

One example is called Mentor's Corner.

There is an introduction video which provides an overview of what is available.

**Mentor's Corner** is now a one-stop shop, which contains everything a mentor, or presenter, might need to deliver in a Lodge, in a Chapter or LOI, or via the internet. There are over 70 presentations, demonstrations, and quizzes, all ready for use and downloaded at the touch of a click! To which we have just added:

**SolomonGPT:** the protoype for a suite of Chatbots, dedicated to each Degree and the Royal Arch. So if you have a question about the First and the Third Degrees, you just type it in the box provided, or pick one of the prepared questions, using your mobile, tablet or computer. It answers in seconds. The Second Degree and Royal Arch modules will follow soon.

**Snippets:** It takes time and effort to find the right nugget for the right meeting and they can take ten minutes to deliver. So, we have selected over a hundred nuggets and short papers from the First Degree, Lodge Matters and History, together with some from 'Discover More' and the Royal Arch, and cut them down to the size, so they can be delivered in under five minutes and can be downloaded individually or en-masse. Search it-Selectit-Snip-it

Within-hail: A set of twenty-five papers and handouts to help whomsoever accompanies those of our members who must leave during a Passing, Raising, or a part of an Installation, by having a short, easy to deliver paper, together with a handout, so everyone can make an advancement in Masonic knowledge.

We have also fully upgraded Lodge Matters with new and improved nuggets and papers, and added some interactive elements, as part of our programme of innovation and improvement.

# Did you know I am a Freemason?

#### Talking openly about our Freemasonry









It can sometimes be hard to know how to start a conversation with someone you know, or a stranger you have met, about being a Freemason. People see articles in the popular press that paint a negative picture but the growing volume of social media, YouTube, and indeed the UGLE and our own Provincial Website, are slowly turning the tide to a more positive footing.

So how do you approach the subject in a conversation? The Member's Pathway has a couple of suggestions with two information sheets on "Being Proud to be a Mason".

In the handout on "Being proud to be a Mason" it suggests.

"If you are likely to be discussing Freemasonry with people who are not Freemasons, it is important to be in a positive frame of mind, proud of your membership, honest and clear about what Freemasonry means to you".

In <u>"Explaining to others what Freemasonry means to you"</u> it provides guidance for Lodge members on how to approach the conversation.

The Member's Pathway suggests the following as a good start but emphasises that you should put things into your own words to make it more compelling that "corporate speak'.

It suggests you include in your explanation things unique to you, such as:

- Your motives for joining
- What you enjoy about Freemasonry
- Details of your own Lodge(s)
- Your family's involvement in Freemasonry

Maybe we all need an 'elevator pitch' – a short pitch which describes what Freemasonry is, what it means to you and a good reason to join.

So how about preparing an 'elevator pitch' in your mind which you can use to start the conversation. I think mine would go along the lines of.......

"Did you know i'm a Freemason, I joined for the camaraderie and I find meetings a safe environment to talk openly to other members, especially now I work from home a lot. It's easy to feel isolated and cut off and I miss the banter from the office. I also like the work we do locally to help the community and feel I am able to give something back to society in general. Our rituals can seem a bit strange at first, but as you get to understand them, they really make you think."

The message is beginning to get across via the charities we support and the work we do in the community but this would be greatly helped by letting us know all the good work you are already doing so we can let the public at large know via our website, social media channels and press releases. We are certainly starting to get traction but we need the material to be able to spread the word.

We can all be justly proud of what we do. At the Charity Evening last November the High Sheriff said:

"The thing that people don't realise is quite how much Freemasonry does in our county".

Many Brethren of a certain age may remember the old BT advert with Maureen Lipman saying "it's good to talk". Let's start the conversation and let people know what we do.

What would be your 'elevator pitch'?

Let me know and we will publish some of the best in a future edition.






