# Would I know the answer?

## Did I know the answer?

### This month I was asked: Measurements?

Freemasonry has always appeared a bit of an enigma for me in its use of symbolism. None more so than its use of measurement. The references to measurement are numerous but not always congruent. Each represents some symbolism for a particular purpose.

Let's start with the 24 inch gauge, or rule. Convenient to represent 24 hours in a day followed by an explanation of its use, it is early on in our Masonic career. We would all be familiar with 24 inches in the past, but since we have gone metric, does it have the same meaning for newer members?

Moving on to the second degree, and King Solomon's Temple, we find that the pillars are seventeen and a half cubits tall, and the outer rim is four inches or a hand's breadth in thickness. So, we have inches, hand's breadth and cubit all in the same sentence. Even more confusing to the 'metric Mason'!

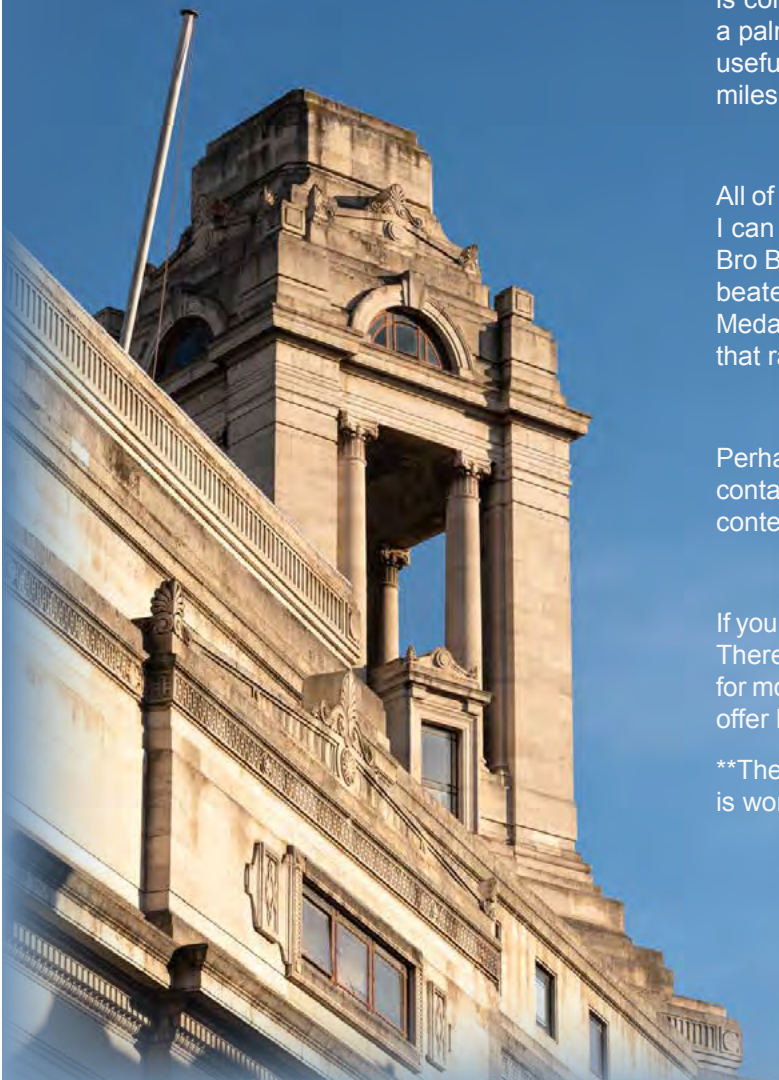
Much of this measurement is of course taken from references in the VSL. Mention is also made in Egyptian and Roman architecture, from Noah's Ark to the pyramids and Solomon's Temple. The word cubit appears to be derived from the Latin for elbow, and all measurements are based on a particular human characteristic; the cubit being the length of the forearm from the middle finger to the end of the elbow. The foot is an obvious explanation and the yard is one stride of a man, or two cubits. A foot is considered to be three palms in length, (4 inches for a palm), and therefore 12 inches. And so it goes on; not useful for those with a metric mind! But then, we still use miles when travelling the roads in the UK!

All of this is very confusing, but as a final point of interest I can tell you that a past member of Vitruvian Lodge, W Bro Berwyn Jones, holds one record which will never be beaten, In the Perth Olympics of 1960 he won a Gold Medal for 100 yards race. After this season it was decided that races should be in metres.

Perhaps we should just enjoy the stories and the history contained therein, and not think too deeply about specific content.

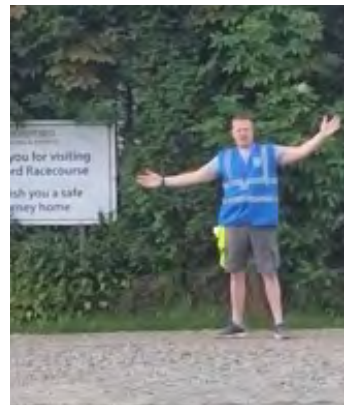

The ‘Name a Puppy Team’ from Guide Dogs for the Blind have sent through their first “pupdate” for ‘Bailey’.

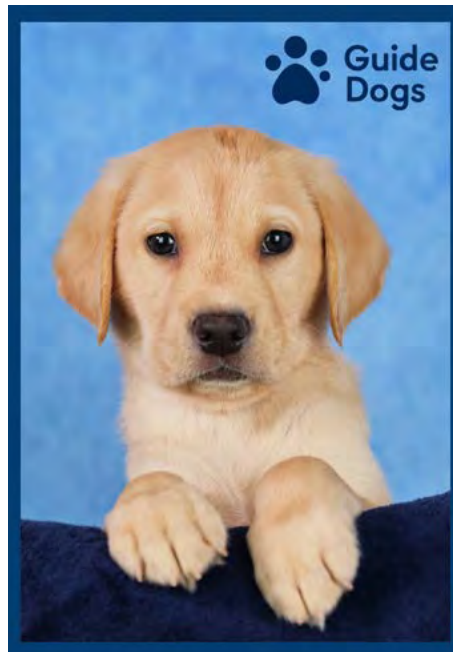
Born on 22<sup>nd</sup> April 2024 and named in memory of W Bro Dick Bailey. Bailey is a yellow labrador and has seven siblings.

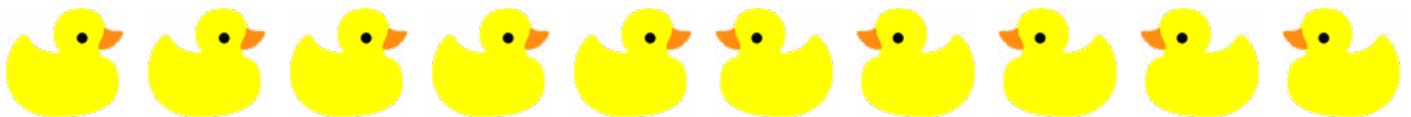
## Headline Race

# MEET ALBERT GAW THE OLDEST INITIATE IN HEREFORDSHIRE (POSSIBLY)

So, this is Albert Chattell Gaw, he was born in Glasgow in 1924, and would have been 100yrs old this year. Chattell, his middle name, can be traced back to his ancestors who were some of the Huguenots driven out of France in the first part of the 18<sup>th</sup> Century, during the reign of King Louis XIV. It seems that Albert's line became boot makers to the Scottish aristocracy.

I first got to know Albert back in the 1960s, when Lesley, his daughter and I became boyfriend and girlfriend at school, but then later, after Lesley and I got back together and married in 1994, he became my father-in-law.

He had known that I was a Freemason for many years, and though he was interested in the fraternity he was concerned that if he joined it might have jeopardised his position as an Elder of his church. However, following my serious illness in 2005/06, and after I was well enough to return to the fold, he approached me and said that he had been very impressed by the way that Freemasons had rallied round and supported both Lesley and me during my time in hospital; in his words, "Better than a lot of churchgoers do" and because of this he wondered if he might become a member.

As Albert was in his eighties, and not likely to play an active role in the Lodge, I did approach the Brethren of Arrow Lodge to see if there would be any objections; there were none. So, the process of Albert's application went ahead.

I was Installed as Master of Arrow Lodge in December 2006 and Albert was initiated into Arrow Lodge in February 2007, at the age of 82, which he told me afterwards was one of the best experiences of his life, and he went on to be Passed and Raised, with part of the latter ceremony having to be done with him sat in a chair, because of his mobility problems.

I used to collect him and bring him to Lodge meetings, and he used to thoroughly enjoy himself, particularly at the festive boards, where he would regale the Brethren with stories of his role in the top-secret work involving radar bases during WWII, and later, after the war, when he had helped with the early guidance systems of hovercraft. I well remember him taking me to the 'Great Hovercraft Show' of 1966, where I saw it being demonstrated.

Unfortunately, Albert broke his hip in early 2009 and later that year, died of a heart problem in Ludlow hospital, and although he had only been a Freemason for a short time, he told me, before his death, that he wished he'd joined Freemasonry years before.

# MEET TIM FYCUN THE YOUNGEST INITIATE IN HEREFORDSHIRE (POSSIBLY)

Having seen Geoff's piece about Albert, who was possibly the oldest Initiate in Herefordshire, I thought I would go to the opposite end of the scale for this story.

I had grown up with an interest in Freemasonry, but as I did not know any Freemasons I was at a loss as to how to join. Fortuitously, I started with a company owned by Richard Thomas and John Mayo Evans, working alongside a sales colleague, Mike Charles. Unbeknown to me at the time, all three were Herefordshire Masons. Sadly, Mike passed away not too long after I started with the company.

One day at work I was called into a meeting with Richard and John and asked about Freemasonry and if I would be interested in joining their Lodge which was Delphis. I of course said yes.

I was Initiated in 2007 and became a Master Mason in 2008 at the age of 35. However, not long after I joined, I moved with my family to Australia to work with my father, and whilst there I became an active member of the local Lodge in Glen Innes, in the state of New South Wales. It amazed me how far the Brethren would travel for a meeting, sometimes many hundreds of miles.

In 2009 I returned with my family to Herefordshire and started working as a foul drainage specialist. Keen to be involved, I rejoined Delphis Lodge and in 2015 I became Master. Sadly, whilst I was in Australia, Richard Thomas passed to the Grand Lodge above, but I was very much heartened to have my other proposer, John Mayo Evans, at my Installation ceremony.

Since 2015, I have joined Ariconium Lodge in Ross on Wye and was Installed as Master in 2020, and I have also been very lucky to have been awarded two active Herefordshire Provincial ranks as Grand Pursuivant and then Junior Grand Deacon.

Freemasonry has given me so much and allowed me to meet many Brethren from various professions, which has led to many friendships that will last all my life.

My eldest Son, also named Tim, was born in 2004 and was three when I joined Freemasonry and grew up watching his Dad mumbling words to himself and putting on a dark suit several evenings a month, and then his Mum bringing him, bundled in his pyjamas, to collect me after Lodge meetings.

I had spoken to Tim quite a lot about the benefits of Freemasonry, so I was overjoyed in 2022 when he came to me and said he felt he was ready to join. Because Tim was a Lewis, he was eligible to join at 18 rather than waiting until he was 21 and in 2023, he was Initiated into Ariconium Lodge when I believe at the time he was possibly the youngest Freemason in Herefordshire.

Tim has enjoyed his Masonic journey so far and will become a Master Mason in September 2024.

As for me I'm a very proud to now be able to also call my son, my Brother.
