

The Dean Leigh Masters' Lodge, No 3687, was consecrated in 1913 by the then Provincial Grand Master, the Right Worshipful Brother, the Very Reverend James Wentworth Leigh, who was Dean of Hereford from 1894 to 1919. The Consecration took place in the Hereford Town Hall, and afterwards the banquet was held at The Green Dragon Hotel.

The Lodge was set up as a Masters' Lodge in order to give those who had completed a year in the Chair of their own Lodge, the opportunity to continue the relationship they had established with many other Masters during that year.

It has traditionally met just three times each year, and has an ethos of providing interesting talks and lectures covering a vast array of subjects, mostly masonic, but occasionally on non-masonic matters.

Its membership currently stands at just below 100 and there is an open invitation to Past Masters from any Lodge to join. The subscription is modest, and there is a reduction for members who continue to hold membership in their Mother Lodge.
